

Rules and Regulations of Camp Summit

1. The following are **not permitted** on the camp premises: Power or Hand Tools, All Terrain Vehicles, Flammables & Fireworks, Personal Sports Equipment, Alcoholic beverages & Pets. Handguns are not permitted in any buildings, program areas or any other areas on the campgrounds that campers may have access to.
2. Use of Camp Summit campgrounds is open to those areas, which have been assigned to your group. More than one group may be present during your stay. Unwanted noise can disturb your neighbors, so please no loud noises, stereos, radios, etc. at any time. Gates are locked at 10:00pm for your protection, unless other arrangements with Site Manager have been made. Any problems need to be reported to the Site Manager immediately.
3. Smoking is permitted ONLY in designated areas. Smoking is **not permitted** inside the buildings, or outside the buildings or lodge. Check with the Site Manager for designated areas. Cigarettes butts must be deposited in proper receptacles. It is a **Fire Hazard** to smoke in unauthorized areas on the campgrounds.
4. **Absolutely no one from your group is allowed in the Archery Area, Fishing Pond, Swimming Pool, Horse Stables, Kitchen or any unauthorized area unless previously authorized by the Dallas Office.**
5. Meals will be served promptly at the following times (unless other arrangements are made in advance of arrival): Breakfast – 8:00 a.m.; Lunch – 12:00 a.m.; Dinner 6:00 p.m.
6. If you have arranged to use the swimming pool or fishing pond, **one lifeguard must be on duty for every 25 persons.** A copy of the certification must be on file in the Dallas Office .
7. All furniture at camp is to be left as found. If you need to re-arrange something, request permission from the Site Manager. Please put all rearranged items back in their proper place prior to leaving.
8. **Only** the Site Manager may approve building of campfires. Please make your arrangements through him/her. Texas weather creates a very dry climate, and Wise County may restrict all fires at certain times of the year. The Site Manager will notify your group upon arrival of this restriction.
9. No unauthorized persons are allowed in the kitchen at any time. Ice can be made available upon request. A refrigerator is available to use in the lodge. An adult supervisor must be assigned to use it.
10. All vehicles must park in the designated parking lot. Speed limit on the campground road is 10 mph. Only passenger vehicles are permitted on the campgrounds. Vehicle driving is not permitted on grass areas and vehicles parked in the designated handicapped parking area must have a permit.
11. The camp must be left in clean condition. Trash receptacles are provided in order to avoid littering of building and grounds.
12. Your group should have at least the following ratio of adults per person under 18 years of age. Children are welcomed. Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult at all program areas. Parents or guardians are responsible for children's behavior at all times.

Age of Campers	Ratio of Adults to Campers Needed
15-18	1 Adult to every 7 Campers
12-14	1 Adult to every 6 Campers
11 and under	1 Adult to every 5 Campers

Group leaders should consider appropriate screening of staff/volunteers responsible for or access to campers.
13. The main Camp telephone is for emergency use only. There is a phone located in the office that is available for local calls.
14. Security----The Site Manager is responsible for grounds security. Any problems should be reported to him/her.
15. Check In & Check Out -----Your arrival and departure time should be coordinated through the Dallas Office, and reconfirmed prior to arrival. The checkout time should be reconfirmed with the Site Manager upon arrival. The Site Manager will perform a walkthrough of the areas you used at check out.

Failure to abide by the rules and regulations could result in your group being asked to leave the property.
